Report by Sandy Hamm Presented to Town Board February 14, 2013

February 2, 2013 The Freeman ran a front page story about a "campaign letter" sent by Supervisor German.

When I read in Supervisor German's letter that the "...Town Board is not functioning as a 5 person board but is being operated as a one person **dictatorship**...," I wondered how anyone could believe such a thing to be true. I decided to investigate.

In the past twelve months, counting motions, 2nds, and votes - in open session, and not counting motions to adjourn, I found the following:

Total Motions made was 176; of that total 161, or 91.5% carried unanimously. Eleven Motions passed with a split vote, and three failed with a split vote. One motion failed to receive a second. That means that **98% of the motions made by the town board passed, and 91.5% of them did so unanimously. That didn't seem like a dictatorship**, so I pressed on.

Van Scyoc's role in making these 176 motions and 2nds was to make only 4 motions and 5 2nds for a total of 9 actions. That is 2.6%. Interestingly, 8 of those 9 actions took place late in 2012 - in October and November.

Supervisor 2, who characterizes Van Scyoc's leadership as a "dictatorship," made 50 motions and 41 2nds for a total of 91 or 26%.

Dictatorship or fully functioning board?

As for specific town issues being put forth, in reviewing the past 12 months' actions I became aware that it was Supervisor German who on December 27, 2011 made two motions to direct the town's attorneys to oppose the Town of Brookfield's incorporation attempt, and that he made a similar resolution on January 17, 2012.

I also learned that it was Supervisor German that moved on February 7 of 2012 to accept the "Jacobson" snowplow contract settlement.

And as for any responsibility for Five Diamonds, it was on March 9, 2012 that Supervisor German made the motion to deny Five Diamonds' request for an extension of hours. And further every single vote by the town board related to Five Diamonds has been unanimous.

And, as for the claim in Supervisor German's letter that he or any Supervisors were kept in the dark about a November 27th meeting...well, the claim is just not accurate, nor does it stand up to scrutiny. The minutes from that November 27th meeting, between Town and Five Diamonds representatives, had been in the Supervisors' packet well in advance of the January 24th meeting.

And, I know for a fact that Supervisor German knew of the now infamous "Five Diamonds" meeting and what transpired, because I had personally given him a draft of the minutes from that meeting - a 3-page document which had mysteriously appeared during the dark of night on my mailbox in a plastic bag during the first week of January 2013. They were not the final, official minutes as drafted by Attorney de la Mora, but an earlier draft from Five Diamonds' Attorney Tikalsky, courtesy I assumed from some supporter of Five Diamonds.
